The role of the dependency court judge involves leadership responsibilities "on-the-bench" via strong judicial oversight of cases <u>AND</u> "off-the-bench" leadership which involves working with court, system and community stakeholders to address the needs of the

children and families.

Without judicial leadership, it would be very difficult to develop, implement, and sustain effective systems change in dependency courts
