FTC Best Practice 7 Therapeutic Responses



Provisions (adapted)

A Child and Family Focus

The goal of all responses is to: support and improve parenting, improve parent child relationships, and increase family function

B Treatment Adjustments

Adjustments are often needed as participants needs become clearer. These should be made based on the expertise of clinical team members. Explain that these changes are for support of healing: not an incentive or sanction

C Complementary Service Modifications

Consider barriers: housing, income, education, transport, disabilities, & trauma Reflect on these barriers when assigning supports AND sanctions

D FTC Phases

Expectations ascending phases are clear, based on specific milestones & objectives. These criteria are laid out in the Policy and Procedures Manual and the Participants Manual.

Phases are one way, demotion to earlier phases does not support recovery.

E Incentives and Sanctions Promote Engagement

Focus of both incentives and sanctions are designed to promote engagement and recovery

Holding participants accountable to expectations is critical, as is individualized support

F Certainty

The team has a system for checking effectiveness and equity of responses Services & Supports are given in a consistent and timely manner

G Equitable Responses

The FTC team should regularly be reflecting on potential for bias and equity of responses for all participants with similar conduct.

H Advance Notice

Participant handbook and policy and procedure manual Identify responses These documents are available to all team members Participants are given a handbook and expectations are explained & clarified

Timely Response Delivery

Participants and Team communicate at least once per week Responses are given for compliant or non-compliant behavior as soon as possible
