




## **Provision A: Maintain Data** Electronically

### Currently Using an Electronic Data **Management System**

13/22 of WA Family-Focused **Treatment Courts are Maintaining** Records using DCCM, Connexis, or some other data management software

## Why Electronic Records?



Ease of Use

Heritability of knowledge to


future teams **Simple Reporting** to grant holders, fundraisers, and stakeholders **Standardization** of data allows comparison, research, and identification of areas to improve



#### Change Management

Electronic Records:

Increase a courts ability to **make modifications & track changes** to meet the team's goals.



#### Evidence-Based

An Adult Drug Court review found:

- Courts with Electronic Records and
  CQI had higher graduation rates
- Courts using paper records had high investment costs and lower graduation rates
   (NPC Research, 2008 review)



## Entering data immediately leads to less mistakes.

#### After 48 hours recall is less than 50%

### After one week most of the detail is lost





## Provision B: Engage in a Process of Continuous Quality Improvement

#### Intentional

Using a careful planning process courts can evaluate where changes will make the greatest impact

## CQI

Continuous Quality Improvement


#### Tracking Progress

Data driven changes improve outcomes and allow us to show stakeholders our successes

#### Gradual

Change takes time! Small improvements that are carefully monitored lead to proven success over time

## Change Management – A CQI Method





**Evaluate and Apply Findings** 

Using your plan of action, test to see if the change was effective, if there were barriers to success, and if it should continue.

**Start again using** what you've learned!

## How often should evaluation occur?

#### Outcomes over time



Look for DRIFT away from mission desired outcomes, fidelity to the best practice model

## **Provision D. Use of Rigorous Evaluation Methods**


Evaluation should generate a report with recommendations for improvement of outcomes and adherence to best practices

### Methods for evaluation should **include all** collaborative systems

Courts that hire an independent evaluator tend to be more cost effective and have better outcomes



# **Tips from Best Practices**



A full program evaluation should occur **EVERY 3-5** 

**Years** using an independent evaluator if possible

Consider a partnership with a university as a

part of a student thesis or capstone, your court may be able to partner for much lower cost and high expertise Before the Evaluation, decide **who "owns" the data**, where it will be housed and how it will be used.
