### **Child Dependency Courts**

Housing instability is a leading factor that contributes to families becoming involved with the child welfare system. Despite being a basic human need, housing has become increasingly difficult for struggling families to achieve. When families are afforded basic needs like housing, they are better able to engage in their case plans, provide a greater level of care to their children and achieve a better sense of personal stability.



**30%** of out-of-home placements of children arise or last longer than necessary because the family lacks adequate housing <u>Source</u>

### **Housing Assistance Definition**

Appropriate referrals by the department or other agencies to federal, state, local, or private agencies or organizations, assistance with forms, applications, or financial subsidies or other monetary assistance for housing. For purposes of this chapter, "housing assistance" is not a remedial service or family reunification service.

# **Hope for the Future**

DCYF Housing Access and Supports 2023-25 Decision Package Pending

The Housing Access and Supports Decision Package provides community-based supportive housing services for young people exiting foster care, juvenile rehabilitation (JR) and for families involved in child welfare. This funding will leverage additional federal funding and housing units for DCYF clients.

This housing commitment is worth over \$30 million per year. The housing organiza-tions are willing to do this only if DCYF can provide the assisted households with supportive services to help them find and keep housing. To create this collaboration, DCYF and the PHAs have negotiated a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). To sign that MOU, DCYF needs the Governor's proposed funding to help it fulfill its MOU service commitment.
